**From wood to bronze.**

### Carved Panels for the Royal Armouries Museum, Leeds..

The first bit of news is confirmation that the Club has secured the grant we applied for from the Leeds Community Foundation. A recent meeting, at Overgate Hospice, was held with Steve Burt, Collections Director of the Armouries, who was very impressed with the craftsmanship, balanced design and selection of subjects for the Overgate Panel. The Armouries confirmed that they are very keen to work with us.

During discussions about finance Steve was asked, if certain items had to be cut back, because of financial restraints, would the Royal Armouries be willing to assist with costs over and above the grant award. Steve assured the meeting that the Royal Armouries would not want the quality; planning or occasion of the finished work to suffer from lack of reasonable funds and any request for additional funding would be evaluated with, hopefully, a positive response by the finance department of the Armouries.

Before we can go much further pictures will have to be collected, selected for carving and the overall diagram of the two Panels agreed. The Armouries are going to make available their archive library. Until this is done timber cannot be purchased. The members of the sub-committee are already gathering together pictures and if any member would like to forward pictures to myself, or Mike Hadfield, they will be considered along with all the others.

It is possible that one or two members have a special family connection in a particular area and, if you submit a picture for carving, the sub-committee will take this into consideration and try where possible to include it in the Panels. However, members must appreciate this may not be possible as the picture may not complement the rest of the Panel. (For example I have a friend whose brother was one of the Cockleshell Heroes and in his memory I would like this to be represented on the 2nd World War Panel, especially as he was a local man from Halifax.)

When we produced the Overgate Panel it was only as an afterthought that we decided to compile a professionally printed booklet and the Club put up front £850 which was returned to funds out of the receipts we got for the booklets. (We still managed to donate £1200 to Overgate.) This time £965 has been included in our grant application so, hopefully, 100% of booklet receipts will go to a children's hospice. The Armouries have agreed to give back to the Club any money taken while the booklets are on sale at the museum. (Incidentally I got a call today from Overgate to say they have just sold the last booklet out of the 1000 we had printed. I have asked the printers for a quote for a further 500—who pays for them I'm not sure.)

A sub-committee of ten volunteer members was formed to oversee this project and at its last meeting it was agreed that the project would benefit from the guidance of a respected member of the Club to act as "Guardian". Duties would be to primarily approve the decisions made by this sub-committee and to use his carving expertise and good sense to ensure the overall project is completed to a standard that is in keeping with the good name of our Club. Albert Hobson, Founder and Life Member of the Club, has kindly accepted this very important and essential position. All meeting minutes will be forwarded to Albert for his approval before action is taken and finished carvings of all participating carvers will be referred to Albert for his approval, or advice, before being accepted for fixing onto the Panels by Bryan and Dennis.

The response for carvers has been quite staggering and a credit to the Club members and reflects the pleasurable experience we have all had producing previous Panels. To date we have 53 carvers signed up. A small number are not full members yet but are anxious to participate and we trust will become members in April 2009. Very nearly all of the 53 attend one or other of the carving classes that the Club runs.
