Sadly, for the second month running, I have to refer to the sad loss of yet another of our long serving and very well liked and respected members.


On the Tuesday17th April 2018 our good friend **Terry Thorley-Lawson** sadly passed away after quite a long drawn out, but bravely endured, illness.
