# Club Meeting May 11th, 2019.

The end of the Spring Meeting Season was nigh... Our final speaker before our Summer holiday was club member David Hey. An eagerly awaited talk, David took us from his early interest in Marquetry to the making a stunning pair of Zodiac themed marquetry side tables.



Starting with marquetry kits, where all materials were provided along with a simple pattern to follow and mark out the veneers to be cut, David clearly took to the process. David explained the differences between the related veneering disciplines of Marquetry (Illustrative Designs), Parquetry (Geometric Designs) and Inlay (Furniture Veneer Decoration). Kits can be purchased from several online retailers. David recommended <a href="https://www.marquetry.org">www.marquetry.org</a> – the Marquetry Society website and <a href="https://www.artveneers.co.uk">www.artveneers.co.uk</a> as good sources of information and supplies.

David shared with us his early attempts at marquetry and his progression through flat panels with an impressive range of subjects to his mastering of the process. On the way he discussed the methods, tools and materials needed. It would be fair to say that David's modesty belies his skill as he went on to show and talk through the designing and making the two side tables.

The first table was an exploration of the Western Zodiac with twelve segments, one for each star sign, the associated months of the year, the planets and constellations.

The second table completed later shows the Chinese Zodiac with similar related signs and symbols to compliment his previous project.

David has now run up against an old problem – space. He confided that "I like to do marquetry on things like tables, but we have more tables than we can use."

I'm sure the members present couldn't fail to be impressed by David's skill in producing these two amazing pieces of craft.
